
Providing Financial Assistance To Poor Families



Families are the core focus of Save A Family Plan since its foundation. Save A Family Plan delivers financial assistance to the poor families in India to enhance their quality of life. The support from Save A Family Plan is used by the partner families for activities like starting small business, house construction, medical treatment, education of children, constructing sanitation facilities etc.

Before using the financial support from Save A Family Plan, the families with the help of Family Development Program field staff, prepare a financial plan to decide how to use the money for their sustainable development. This process helps the families to have an ownership of the program and become more aware about their opportunities and resources.

These trainings make the families aware about the opportunities and challenges in doing various Income generation programs. Diverse skills are taught to new partner families such as financial management, marketing strategies, time management etc., help them to start their small scale business.

Story of Merlin from Vallavilla, Tamilnadu

Merlin, a widow with two children was staying in her unsecure house when the Family Development Program staff met her. She was very depressed and suffering from anxiety because of her husband's unexpected loss. The Family Development Program staff gave her psychological support and provided her entrepreneurship training in umbrella making and detergent making. With the continuous support and follow up by our staff, Merlin was able to master the skills of umbrella making, detergent making and the candle making. Now she is earning a good amount as income from these businesses and extend her sincere thanks to Save A Family Plan.

Changing Lives Of The Poor Through Livelihood Initiatives



Through regular house visits, our field staff ensures that, the families are doing profitable and sustainable income generation programs and constantly gives them guidance and feedbacks to improve their profit and productivity from such activities. Save A Family Plan fosters the poor families to stay on their feet even after the six years support period through income generation programs.

Meet Sindhu from Aravila, Kerala

It had been a great disaster for Sindhu after she lost her husband in an accident at the sea and left over with her children in a dilapidated house. She is also suffering from intracranial hypertension which prevented her from doing any regular work. The Family Development Program staff got in touch with her and inspired her to start an income generation program with the assistance. Sindhu commenced her tailoring work and started developing her hidden skills. Our program staff, constantly stayed in contact with her and visited her in person to provide guidance and feedback. She simultaneously opened a beauty parlour at her home, which is also giving her additional income. Now she has developed into a decent entrepreneur and earning stable and good income from her small businesses.

In India, Widows and Abandoned women from poor and vulnerable families face numerous challenges from the society and even from their own families. Being the only bread winner of the family, they often find it very hard to meet the basic expenses such as food, education and medicine. Unequal payment given to women and the scarcity of employment opportunities add weight to the crisis faced by the widows from poor families in India. The *social stigma* surrounding in widows and abandoned women is still a monumental problem in India, which result *treating them unequally* in different social circumstances.

What we do

Our experienced and trained staff provide Emotional and Psychological support to widows and abandoned women from the partner families and builds trust and confidence in them to face diverse challenges.

Our financial support helps them to start their own small scale business and become self reliant.

Save A Family Plan empowers them through various capacity building programs, awareness classes and enabling them to mobilize resources locally from government.



Promising Better Future By Ensuring Better Education To Children

Our field animators continuously visit the families to monitor the educational progress of children, consult with the school teachers and provide guidance to parents to guarantee that their children are getting better education. The animators also make the families aware about various scholarships available for students and help them to mobilize local resources for educational support.

Meet Malathi from Aruvankadu, Tamilnadu

Malathi is the only bread winner of her family since her husband is physically ill. Her son Vignesh ran away from home while he was studying in 8thgrade. Malathi got in touch with Family Development Program staff and they immediately contacted the school teachers and Police department. With the help of Family Development Program staff, the police was able to find the child very soon. Our staff provided in-depth counseling to Vignesh and able to motivate him to continue his studies. The program staff met with family and school teachers and provided counseling to the family to avoid future circumstances which can affect him. As a result of our regular follow up and monitoring, Vignesh completed his 10th standard successfully and now studying for professional catering course in Chennai, Tamilnadu. Malathi and her family are thankful for the timely intervention of Save A Family Plan which helped her child to successfully continue his studies.

Family Development Program gives high significance to the health of partner family members. Save A Family Plan ensures the well being of the partner families by providing them with health awareness trainings, enrolling the partner families into health insurance schemes and constantly monitoring their health status through house visits. We assist pregnant mothers and adolescent girls for accessing nutritious food from local health care centres.



Stories From The Field



Kodigaon Tolla is a small and underdeveloped village having only 32 houses. Most of the people in the village belong to Scheduled Tribes. When the SPED IV program started in the village, people were doubtful and participation in the village meetings was less. Everything was new to them since the village is untouched with developmental interventions. The trainings related to the importance of preserving ground water and the construction of community soak pit by the SPED IV program was an eye opener to the villagers. Slowly the SPED IV activities gained momentum in the village. The villagers came forward and showed their willingness to construct one more soak pit with their own contribution.

People of Baithane village had no good road access before SPED IV had made a crucial intervention in their community. The SPED staff motivated the Village Action Team(a local initiative formed by SPED IV program) members to apply for government scheme for road construction. As a result the district panchayat and taluk panchayath sanctioned Rs.2,74,000 for the road construction from Hosmata to Vaalya. The participatory effort was really a learning for the villagers and they further approached the government through Village Action Team to get support for the remaining construction of the road from Vaalya to Ulippu. The collective effort came in to a success when the local government sanctioned Rs.12,00,000 for road construction.
